For each disease or pathogen, a link is provided to a webpage with summary information on internationally available vaccines and WHO policy recommendations, together with other key resources. Under 'Pipeline vaccines' is a list of some pathogens for which vaccines and/ or monoclonal antibodies (mAbs) are in development.

Priority pathogens for which WHO is actively engaging to accelerate the development of vaccines and mAbs for use in LMICs are identified by WHO's Product Development for Vaccines Advisory Committee (PDVAC). For these diseases or pathogens, a link is provided to a vaccine candidate pipeline, and related WHO activities and publications.
